<p>Understand technology and procedural landscape</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Take inventory of existing systems and procedures that are unable to meet the requirements of IDMP • Identify data silos and repositories that need to be updated and connected
<p>Evaluate data readiness and perform remediation</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Establish consistent nomenclature and data definitions • Plan and execute data remediation projects • Craft a sustainment plan to ensure that future data meets IDMP requirements
<p>Establish data ownership and accountability</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Develop documentation on data handling for consistency and compliance • Tie data ownership to functional areas • Establish a culture of compliance with proper training and accountability for data integrity
<p>Modernize regulatory operations</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify and implement a scalable RIM system • Ensure data repositories are properly linked across the organization • Digitize RegOps and shift away from manual information repositories and spreadsheets
